3. ABPI Congress

2023

• ABPI's 43rd International Congress on Intellectual Property welcomed about 900 participants, with 530 attending in person. The Congress website recorded 15,365 page views from 2,576 visits. Most visits originated from Brazil, followed by the United States, Portugal, and Argentina, encompassing 39 countries. On Instagram, the content reached 30,348 accounts, while on LinkedIn, it achieved a milestone with 32,606 total impressions.

2022

• ABPI's 42nd International Congress on Intellectual Property had 755 participants, with 428 attending in person and 327 online. Nearly a hundred attendees were international, representing 23 countries, including Argentina, Peru, Venezuela, Chile, Portugal, and the United States. The ABPI website received 7,791 views from 256 visitors, predominantly from Brazil, followed by the United States and Portugal.
