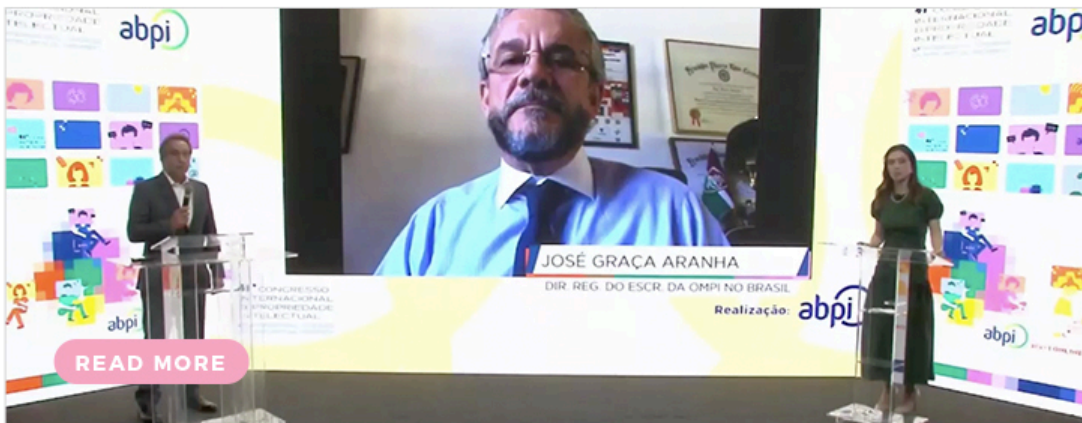




End of fiscal deficit and sustained economic growth

Amorim highlighted that the circular economy will lean towards becoming increasingly important, and there will be an increase in society's interest in cleaner and more sustainable products

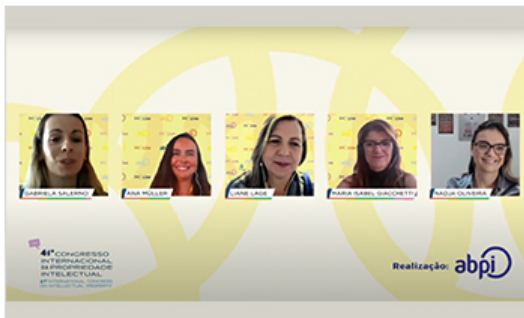

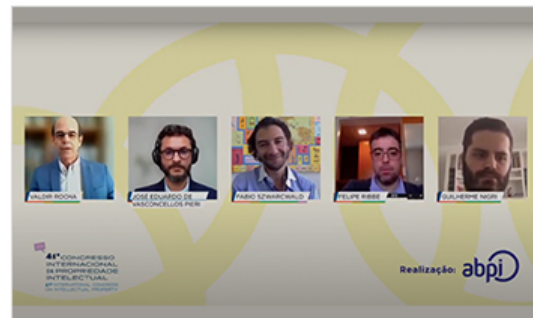
